Sizewell C. Following their attendance at September's Parish Council meeting, The Community Relations Team for Sizewell C have declined Council's invitation to attend another. Slow down, they drive too fast...Council continues to receive concerns from residents about speeding traffic through the village. Parish Councillors share these worries and remain committed to doing all they can to make the roads as safe as possible. Work with SCC Highways continues and at its most recent meeting, Council passed a motion to request that Suffolk County Council reviews its speed policy and supports a reduction to 20mph limit throughout Yoxford.
