### Village Matters

**Update following the floods since October** 2023. The floods remain a key focus for the village and, at its last meeting, District and County Councillors presented their update. In summary, both Councillors confirmed that initial payments of £500 had started to be issued to affected households. Further grants which should have been applied for, have not yet been processed. Parish Council Precept: Aware that Council Tax bills will rise and not wanting to add to parishioners increasing costs, Yoxford Parish Council voted to implement a 0% increase to its Precept request for 2024/5.

**Speeding traffic:** Further to County Councillor Richard Smith's rejection of Parish Council's request to support a review of road speed limit policy, Council remains committed to a 20mph policy for the village but will also be exploring further, what it can do to encourage drivers to take care on village roads. Measures are expensive and take time to implement but rest assured that Yoxford Parish Council is looking into best practice and best value.
